ABOUT THE WINE

Tomato, tomato-o, let's talk about Ramato! Ramato is a winemaking style unique to Pinot Grigio, particularly in the Northern Italian region of Friuli, which is not coincidentally the region that shares a long border and a lot of wine history and culture with Slovenia. This style comes from the Italian word, "rame" which means copper, and is a nod to the coppery pink hue that is often produced by Pinot Grigio grapes when given a small amount of skin-contact. It's similar in color to both orange and rose wine; and while there is a case to be made it could be related to the two other styles, its unique historical style to this area means it's really its own thing. The wines are super food friendly, complex and while many are still super affordable can be amazingly complex options compared to generic cheap Pinot Grigios from Northern Italy. We don't know many people make this style of wine in neighboring Slovenia, but it makes sense that these old wine-making traditions don't stop at modern borders. This particular wine from the Pullus line, which is focused on presenting varietal-specific aromatics in individual wines, is aged just between 2-3 days on the skins; so its hue and body is light and approachable. Pullus is a line of wines produced by Ptujška Klet Winery, whose history stretches back an unbelievable amount of time.
